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# **Bone Builders News**

It was just about a year ago that we began to realize that shutting everything down for two weeks to "flatten the curve" of the Covid 19 virus spread was turning into something much bigger and much longer. For a while it was a situation that was changing by the day and sometimes by the hour. All of the things that made life normal, enjoyable and familiar were closed down and replaced by new guidelines to live by. Those guidelines were not normal or familiar and made life seem very frightening at times. But we took it one day at a time and made it through a difficult year.

Now with the vaccine on the scene for more than two months, we are finally emerging from that difficult time when it was sometimes easy to lose hope and feel like it would never end. I know I felt absolutely elated when I walked out of my second vaccine appointment, knowing that there was finally a light at the end of this very long tunnel!

One the best things to happen is the re-starting of Bone Builders classes as of April 1 ! Of course there are still some guidelines to follow to ensure our safety but I think many of us are willing to do whatever is necessary to get back to class . I think the process that we will follow will be sort of like taking baby steps until we are finally at the point that life feels normal again.

One guideline is that anyone who attends Bone Builders must be at least 14 days past their second vaccination if they received Pfizer or Moderna or 14 days past their one vaccination of Johnson & Johnson. For those who are unvaccinated and want to be exercising, there is still a **Zoom class** actively meeting , a class on **PEGTV** and our **website**. These are all options so give me a call at **775-8220 X 102** if you want to find out more.

I have put together a packet for each class that is ready to resume meeting and exercising. The packet includes a Covid 19 Vaccination Form to record each person's vaccination dates, a Sign In Sheet requiring date, name and telephone number, to be signed each class meeting. This one is for contact tracing in the unlikely case that we would need it. There is also a Waiver Form to sign just the first time you return to class . There are also disinfectant wipes and hand sanitizer included in the packet.

### Here are the protocol we will need to follow to resume classes:

- Sign the daily attendance sheet for contact tracing purposes.
- Sanitize or wash hands before entering the exercise space.
- Wear a mask .
- Have dedicated weights for each participant. Do not share weights.
- Wipe down pens between use.
- Wash your hands regularly.
- Avoid touching your face.
- Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue, then throw the tissue in the trash.
- If you feel sick or learn that you have had contact with someone who is sick, stop teaching/attending class immediately.
- Keep a list of anyone you come into close contact with should case contact tracing be required.

I anticipate that we will be able to eventually drop many of these protocol as time goes on. I will let you all know as soon as that happens. I also hope to be able to conduct Refresher and Training Workshops in the Fall, based on the guidelines we receive from the Vermont Department of Health . Welcome back Bone Builders!!
